Table: Sales Reps

Fields:

- Sales Rep = A user field
- Total Manger – Manage Access = Totals the field Manage Access from the table Manager

Table: Manager

Fields:

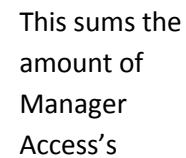
- Manager = A user field
- Manage Access = A calculation that says if the user is the manager then "1" else "0"

Table: Reporting Access

Fields:

- Manager
- Manager – Manage Access
- Related Manager = unique ID from Manager Table
- Sales Rep
- Related Sales Rep – unique ID from Sales Reps Table

The secret sauce is in the total Manager Manage Access field. This value is listed as a "1" in the manager table, then that one is duplicated across the Reporting Access's table. Then it totaled and added to every sales rep. Therefore, each sales rep has a 1 or 0 based on if they were in the reporting access table which shows "who can see who".



This sums the amount of Manager Access's
